

Overall results


These charts show the average Cambridge Checkpoint score for English as a Second Language and each English as a Second Language strand compared to the International Cambridge Lower Secondary average.

Overall results


These charts show the average Cambridge Checkpoint score for Mathematics and each Mathematics strand compared to the International Cambridge Lower Secondary average.




Cambridge Lower Secondary Science overview

IT Club

The IT Club consisted of 30 tech-savvy students during the session 2025–26. The club aimed to enhance students' ICT knowledge, creativity, teamwork, and technical skills through activities like Web Designing, Presentation, Troubleshooting, Scratch, and Python Programming.

Road Safety Club

Teacher/s In-charge: Mr. Braj Mohan Panwar & Mr. Sandeep Gaur

The Road Safety Club for 2025-26, with 17 student members, worked to promote awareness about traffic rules, safe road practices, and responsible commuting. Students learned the meanings of road signs, discussed safety etiquette for riders and drivers, and completed questionnaires to assess knowledge.

Demonstrations and poster-making activities illustrated safe practices and strengthened understanding. The club successfully fostered awareness and responsibility toward road safety within the school community.

Chemistry Club

Teacher/s In-charge: Dr. Neerja Chaturvedi & Ms. Shammi Somanı

The Chemistry Club helped students explore the applications of chemistry in everyday life through practical learning. Members learned to differentiate between hard and soft water, separate immiscible liquids, and safely perform glass-cutting techniques.

They collected carbon dioxide gas, practiced filtration, explored fingerprinting, studied fire extinguishers, and performed microscale experiments. Students also prepared oil paint and soap, gaining hands-on experience that strengthened scientific curiosity and skills.

Travel Enthusiasts' Club

Teacher/s In-charge: Ms. Sumona Gupta & Ms. Sangeeta Merani

The Travel Enthusiasts Club inspires students to explore, discover, and appreciate the world around them. The Club activities included creating a list of dream destinations and marking them on a world map to enhance global awareness. Members learned about budget-friendly travel through a backpacking session and exchanged souvenirs to promote cultural appreciation. Collaborations with the Origami and Cookery Clubs allowed students to explore global cultures through art and cuisines. With guidance from the Sports Department, they learned about trekking equipment and practiced setting up a tent. The club nurtures curiosity, creativity, and a spirit of adventure.

French Club

Teacher/s In-charge: Ms. Rashi Kewalramani

The club aims to promote and broaden students' knowledge of the French language and the country of France, along with its culture.

Students were familiarised with the French alphabet and sounds through songs. They listened to popular French children's stories and learned numbers and greetings through games and videos. Vocabulary building was reinforced through famous songs and poems. Basic French verbs were introduced through songs, and informal quizzes were conducted to assess learning. For the final presentations, students prepared short videos introducing themselves in French.

Robotics Club

To understand the importance of robotics in daily life and develop foundational STEM skills, club members engaged in activities such as assembling and programming the mBot 2 Robot, working with light and colour sensor programs, and exploring LED colour programming using Python.

Bird-Watching Club

The Bird Watching Club introduces students to various birds, sparks curiosity about nature, and helps them discover a passion for scientific exploration. Members observed birds around the school campus, listing both common and rare species. They collected feathers and tracked migratory birds visiting Ana Sagar Lake. A visit to Mayo College Aviary is scheduled in the month of December.

INTACH Club

Teacher In-charge: Ms. Mansi Jha

The INTACH Club encourages students to appreciate India's heritage, traditions, and art forms. Members participated in quizzes on the history and monuments of Ajmer and Rajasthan. Key activities included the Heritage Treasure Box, where students brought family heirlooms or stories to share; Exploring Local Heritage, which involved researching INTACH sites of Ajmer; and Living Heritage and Traditions, where students discussed festive foods.

Through these activities, students developed pride in their roots and a deeper understanding of India's diverse cultural legacy.

Eco Club & Gardening Club (Green Gatherers)

The club fosters environmental awareness. Children used gardening tools, planted flowering plants, painted stones, created crafts, and pledged to avoid plastic bags. The objective of this club is to help students create innovative things using waste materials.

Members transformed waste materials into creative items such as bookmarks, cards, puppets, pen stands, and decorated reused diyas. They also made the best use of old magazines, wrapping sheets, aluminium foil, ice cream sticks, old CDs, socks, water bottles, and cardboard to curate items of utility.

Culinary Club (Cook Without Fire)

Teacher/s In-charge: Ms. Gunjan Bhardwaj, Ms. Khushboo Gupta & Ms. Susan Foote

The Cookery Club encourages students to understand the value of nutritious food and adopt healthy eating habits. It nurtures their interest in cooking while enhancing their culinary skills. Members learned

cooking techniques, ingredient measurement, and maintaining kitchen hygiene - from preparation to cleaning up. They also expanded their food vocabulary and maintained personal cookery books recording recipes for appetisers, main courses, and desserts. Students prepared various dishes, including salads, shakes, mocktails, masala chach, chaat, snacks, biscuit layer cake, Monaco biscuit toppings, Mexican corn salad, tri-colour sandwiches, and choco walnut brownies, developing creativity and learning teamwork in the kitchen.

Public Speaking Club (Elocution)

The Public Speaking Club aims to enhance communication skills, build confidence, spark creativity, and encourage teamwork. Calligraphy Club

The members of the club formed their own calligraphy styles by mixing different styles.

Art/Craft /Clay Modelling Club

Teacher/s In-charge: Ms. Ekta Sharma, Ms. Shalini Tripathi & Mr. Gobinda Murmu

Art, craft and design stimulate creativity and imagination. It provides visual, tactile and sensory experiences and a special way of understanding and responding to the world. It enables children to communicate what they see, feel and think through the use of colour, texture, form, pattern and different materials and processes. Children become involved in shaping their environments through art, craft and design activities. They learn to make aesthetic and practical decisions.

Craft Activities: The students learnt creating flowers with shells, wooden coaster decoration with mirrors, bookmarks, pen stand from plastic bottles. They also learnt making rakhi, decorating diya and paper quilling greeting cards.

Introduction

Co-curricular activities play a pivotal role in nurturing well-rounded learners who are academically capable, socially confident, emotionally balanced, and creatively expressive. These activities offer students meaningful opportunities to develop essential life skills while extending learning beyond the classroom. Across the Primary Section, students engaged in dramatics, art, dance, music, craft, clay modelling, physical education, and digital projects, all aimed at fostering imagination, analytical thinking, and holistic development.

Inter-House Activities

Students of Classes III to V participated with enthusiasm in Inter-House events that encouraged creativity and expression. These included Hindi and English story enactment, character enactment, creative writing, and a variety of performing arts such as vocal and instrumental music and solo and group dance. Students also demonstrated visual creativity through rangoli making, clay modelling, poster designing, and digital tasks such as brochure creation and PowerPoint presentations.

These events helped students enhance communication, teamwork, and critical thinking, while also instilling a healthy competitive spirit.






